



Know Your Risks for Hepatitis A and Hepatitis B: Vaccine-Preventable Hepatitis (VPH)

To see if you are at risk for **hepatitis A** or **hepatitis B**, check the statements below that apply to you.

- I am a gay or bisexual man.
- I have been treated for a sexually transmitted disease.
- I have had more than one sex partner during a six-month time period.
- I have sex with or live with a person who has hepatitis A or hepatitis B.
- I have used street drugs, injectable or other, even once.
- I have chronic liver disease.
- I have a medical condition such as a blood-clotting factor disorder, a bleeding disorder that requires transfusion, or I am or will be on kidney dialysis.
- I have traveled outside of the U.S., to countries other than Western Europe, Canada, Japan, Australia and New Zealand.
- I live in a community where cases of hepatitis A are common.
- I am an immigrant from an area of the world with moderate or high rates of hepatitis B.
- I am a healthcare or public safety worker who is exposed to blood.
- I provide direct service for people with developmental disabilities.

If you checked one or more statements, you may be at risk for hepatitis A or hepatitis B, so ask your healthcare provider about vaccination. This form may be helpful in discussing viral hepatitis with your provider, so print a copy and bring it with you to your next visit.
